

- PSE Standards Development Committee prepared <u>185 recommendations to</u> government covering nine categories of barriers to PSE faced by students.
  - Government held consultations for sector representatives in fall 2023.
- University sector must work together to implement the recommendations once finalized by government.
- Work will be led by the sector's Reference Group on Accessibility: Co-chaired by the Ontario Council of Academic Vice-Presidents (OCAV) and the Council of Senior Administrative Officers (CSAO) and includes senior representation from a variety of areas including student affairs, libraries, HR, EDI, AODA coordinators, public affairs and the Inter-University Disability Issues Association (IDIA).
  - RGoA will strike working groups to tackle the barrier themed recommendations (see slide 6).
- Five-phase work plan has been developed to support the sector's implementation of the soon-to-be finalized recommendations (see next slide)

### **Overview of Recommendations**

Following government engagement sessions, RGoA put forward six recommendations to MCU/MSAA:

- 1. Provide **targeted funding for accessibility priorities** related to supporting the implementation of the PSE Standards;
- 2. Enhance the Accessibility Fund for Students with Disabilities (AFSD);
- 3. Enhance the Bursary for Students with Disabilities (BSWD);
- 4. Provide funding to institutions to support the **multifaceted evaluation of accessibility-related technology and the development of a repository** of the findings, reducing duplication of effort across the sector;
- 5. Support the **creation of a repository of accessible learning** objects;
- 6. Provide financial assistance to institutions to **improve available data on students** with disabilities while streamlining processes, reducing duplication and leveraging existing leading practices on data collection.



## **Role of the Working Groups**

Cross-affiliate Working Groups to assess the recommendations on the following to help inform the development of sector-wide resources and the prioritization of work.

Each Working Group would develop a Terms of Reference to identify clear deliverables as the project takes shape. Some Working Groups may cross-collaborate on overlapping considerations, such as:

- Potential impacts on the operations of universities
- Potential impacts on relevant stakeholders (students, faculty, staff, vendors, etc.)
- Prioritization of work focus based on:
  - Implementation of timelines in the PSE Standards (adjusted based on feedback from MCU/MSAA re: legislated timelines) and how these intersect with available technologies and expertise in both French and English
  - Legal and procedural feasibility
  - Prerequisite items prior to compliance with PSE Standards (if applicable)
  - Work and level of effort required by the sector to develop resources



# Role of RGoA in Standards Implementation

The Reference Group will help oversee the composition and mandate of cross-affiliate working groups that will assess the recommendations to help inform the development or sector-wide resources and the prioritization of work.

Reference Group members are free to join any of the Working Groups at their discretion but are not obligated to do so.

The Reference Group will advise on additional review and approval processes within the sector before any products or resources are considered final.

### 1. Student Services & Admissions

#### **Suggested Guiding Principle(s):**

- Avoid duplication of efforts across PSE institution and sector
- Reduce administrative burdens from SWD and ASO staff
- Ensure SWD data is kept confidential and secure

#### Recommended Sector Deliverables:1

- Identify bottlenecks and social barriers for SWD
- Streamline student supports and processes (e.g. obtaining medical documentation)
- Provide non-academic accommodations
- Reduce financial barriers via expansion of student's eligibility requirements for institutional aid
- Ensure equitable support for part-time students with disabilities

(R)



## 2. Awareness & Training

#### **Suggested Guiding Principle(s):**

- Consider intersectional and human rights<sup>1</sup>
   approaches to training
- Consider Indigenous and EDI-informed approaches to accessibility training
- Develop training with, and facilitation led by, people with disabilities

#### Recommended Sector Deliverables:3

- Developing standardized, mandatory<sup>2</sup> training for employees, educators, and staff (including training on different types of disabilities)
- Implementing review process that would come into effect every 3 years

- Training Guide for Staff, Educators, and Administrators
